Time Schedule: Retreats generally begin on Monday at 8 PM and end Friday morning, unless otherwise specified. You are welcome to come early for supper (6 PM), but kindly call ahead.

Cancellations:

If you must cancel, please notify us as soon as possible. If cancellation is made a week or less before a retreat, an offering of \$25 is requested.

Directions from North or South via I-95:

Take Exit 16- New Rochelle - at end of ramp make a LEFT turn. Make a quick right under the railroad bridge. Go Pass one traffic light & (staying the right lane) at the next traffic light make a LEFT turn-staying in the right lane – you will go pass the Raddison Hotel-at the traffic light make a RIGHT– Go pass other another traffic light and make a LEFT at the next traffic light onto Rte 1 N (Main St) Go about 2 miles, pass Salelsian HS & Dunk n Donuts on your right. Two blocks later, make a RIGHT onto Dillon Rd. (you will see CVS/Staples/ Mrs.Green’s on your left & Larchmont Used Car lot on your right). Go down the hill, Dillon Rd. becomes Pryer Manor Rd. Trinity is the last house on the right before the bridge.

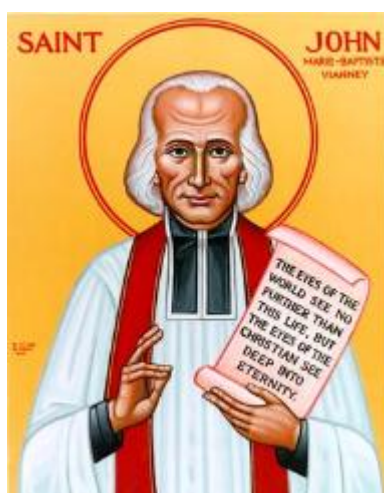
